Accommodation

1. University Housing

Housing at Portland State is very popular because of the moderate rental fees and convenient location to PSU classes and downtown Portland. The on-campus residence halls also provide support services and an active social atmosphere. University Housing is assigned when spaces are available and are based on the date your contract is received. SIGN UP AS SOON AS POSSIBLE to have on-campus housing when you arrive. Once admitted to PSU and you are assigned a PSU ID number, you can complete a Housing contract online or download a paper contract form. The Housing office prefers to communicate using e-mail, so all correspondence from housing will be sent to the email address you provide.

2. More detailed information about housing in Portland:

- Affordable housing in Portland is in demand and it may take you several weeks to find suitable permanent housing. The main campus is centrally located in downtown Portland. You may also want to consider living in nearby neighborhoods. The city is divided into 6 sections: North (N), Northeast (NE), Northwest, South (S), Southeast (SE), and Southwest (SW). The Willamette River divides the east and west sides of the city and Burnside Street is the dividing line between north and south Portland. All of these areas are easily accessible to campus by public transportation.
- Off-campus housing provides more options in terms of living conditions, facilities, and privacy, but may not be as conveniently located as on-campus housing. As housing is expensive, single students might consider living with roommates while studying here. The per-person cost of a shared apartment ranges from \$450 to \$700 or more per month. If you do not have housing arranged you should be prepared to stay in a local motel for several nights.
- Food costs vary widely according to habits and appetites, but students who shop carefully and eat mostly at home can expect to spend \$300 to \$700 per month on food.
- College Housing Northwest is a local not-for-profit organization that owns and manages a number of residential properties in the downtown Portland area that are only available to college or university students. Students may attend any college or university in the Portland area.

- When renting an apartment, it is often necessary to sign a rental contract for a period of one year, and to pay the rent for the first and last month plus a security deposit of at least \$250 to \$1000 in advance. In most cases, you will have to pay monthly bills for telephone service and utilities (gas and electricity) in addition to the rent. You will also need to pay an installation fee (approximately \$40) for telephone service and a deposit for utility service (deposits vary but could be \$150 or more.)

3. Host Family (Short-term and Long-term) You can also request to stay with a Portland family in their home. To arrange a short or long-term homestay you can contact Friends of Overseas Citizens and University Students (FOCUS) or apply for a homestay through their web portal. Please note that FOCUS is a Christian organization but it is open to all students. Another homestay organization is ANDEO International Homestays, a non-profit organization that specializes in providing host families for international students living in Portland.

4. Portland State University operates its own private hotel - University Place Hotel & Conference Center. To be certain you have a room please make reservations directly with the hotel prior to your arrival. Students may choose this option if they will be arriving in Portland earlier than they can move in to their apartment or if they are still looking for an apartment after arriving.

- ◆ College of Business Administration is restricted to students who are currently majoring in business or economics at home university. Considering the current lack of course capacity for exchange students, CBA has decided that from Fall 2019's admission, they will strictly control the number of accepted exchange students to CBA to provide quality education and better administrative support. In this regard, it is more likely than the past that students who apply for CBA might get rejected during the screening procedure.
- ◆ Undergraduate applicants for Dept. of Computer Science and Engineering must have earned at least 15 credits in CSE-related courses (one credit corresponds to 15 lecture hours or 30 lab hours). This must be explicitly shown on the official transcript; if not, additional proof must be presented by the student
Starting from Spring 2020's admission, CSE has decided to control the number of accepted exchange students on the undergraduate-level, due to lack of course capacity and placement. During the screening procedure, various criteria (including GPA) could be used in determining acceptance.
