

學校簡介

釜慶大學位於韓國釜山廣域市，釜山是韓國第二大的都市，且學校位於地鐵慶星大/釜慶大站，附近因為有許多大學，是學生族群集中地，因此生活機能十分便利。學校附近不僅餐廳及咖啡廳林立，更有電影院及各種品牌的服飾店可以在課後休閒時間逛街，在學校另一邊也有大型的超市，裡面有許多生活必需品，可以用比市價更低廉的價錢買到。釜慶大學是釜山唯一不建在山上的學校，相對較輕鬆方便，而學校裡更有林蔭大道，在秋天時可以看到銀杏，春天時則有櫻花盛開，學生在天氣好的時候也會在樹下野餐或喝酒聊天，是一個氣氛和風景都很好的地方。

國外研修之課程學習(課內)

這次交換我總共選了三門課程：基礎韓語、影像英語、分析化學。基礎韓語是最多交換生會上的課，我雖然之前有自學過韓文，但因為想讓自己發音更標準，所以也有選擇這門課，我認為老師非常活潑有趣，也會補充很多課本上沒有的單字，增加我們的單字量，但我認為若是要針對發音上的矯正，可能因為課堂上學生太多，無法一個一個分別教導，而且班上學生大部分都是對韓文完全不了解的，所以不會特別說明複雜的發音規則，但整體上課的氛圍還是非常輕鬆愉快的。影像英語的老師並不是韓國人，而是紐西蘭人，學則這門課的原因是因為學校裡並沒有類似的客，而我平常又很喜歡看外國影集和電影，所以想試著學習一般日常中常用到的英語，增加自己的外語能力，而老師也十分熱情，常常會讓學生起來念電影中的對答，增加他們的口說能力，上課也非常輕鬆而無壓力，也能學到美式和英式不同的日常對話，考試也很簡單，是一門有趣而沒有壓力的課程。分析化學的老師是韓國人，但上課及投影片都是用英語教學，但老師口音有點重，常常不太理解他在說甚麼，但可能是因為是大一的課，所以內容並不難，但在這學期裡是我花最大的心力準備的課。

國外研修之生活學習(課外)

釜慶大學裡有一個 I-Friend 社團，主要是提供韓國學生及外國學生交流的，他們不僅會舉行歡迎會及歡送會，也會在特別的節日舉辦派對活動，讓外國學生也能在異國體驗過節的氣氛。例如中秋節，是韓國的重要節日之一，他們舉辦的活動，讓我們體驗了韓國的民俗遊戲；而萬聖節和聖誕節也有舉辦派對，教我們做卡片及做聖誕裝飾，都非常有趣。平常也會有 I-Hobby 的活動，是提供不同的主題，例如：做魚餅體驗、練歌房、穿著傳統韓國服飾.....等等，讓有興趣的韓國人及外國人報名參加，我自己最喜歡的是做魚餅的體驗，因為魚餅是釜山最有名的食物，而那個體驗教室感覺十分道地，用料也很大方，我們用一萬韓元做了一根魚餅和一片魚餅比薩，能看到自己做的成品在烤爐上，讓專業的人員烘烤後，坐在旁邊享用的體驗，非常特別且有趣，而且也在那場體驗上認識了要好的韓國朋友，讓我十分開心。

感想與建議

英語心得：
