感言及心得感想

首先必須感謝交換校的國際處人員和當地交到的各國和台灣朋友，他們在我遇到各種困難的時候盡可能的給我幫助，幫了我非常大的忙。交換校的國際處也為交換生組織了許多活動，例如城市內外的校外旅遊、節日派對、國際之夜(交換生介紹自己國家)等等，讓我有不少機會可以了解歐洲文化也能和其他人介紹台灣。

課內學習的部分推薦選修主修相關的幾個課程和當地生活直接能用上的德文課，讓我學到最多的是德文課和一堂財務相關的課程。德文課學到的內容在日常生活非常實用，基本上可以現學現用，非常推薦；而財務相關的課程中，老師在講課中常常會提到他們之前在企業中的實際經驗，不會只有理論而是會時常提到現實的例子。當然英文能力十分重要，直接影響到課堂上和後續複習的理解程度和速度。

課外的部分也非常建議規劃好時間，利用機會去德國各地甚至歐洲各地自己有興趣的地方看看。例如我對歐洲中世紀到近代的歷史、武器和老建築很有興趣，就去了紐倫堡和周邊城市以及柏林等等比較遠的地方參觀了不少舊城區和宮殿城堡，也參觀了不少博物館、納粹行政機關舊址和集中營。這些地方通常保存了許多留存至今的文物和建築設施，除了舊城區街區之外，能看的文本量和資訊量也非常龐大，去一次就能看完的機會不大，能學到的東西非常多。

日常生活中遇到不同國家的同學時也建議不要帶著偏見或刻板印象交流，有時候會發現沒有那麼多之前認為的刻板印象。在做事情的時候最好提前先做好規劃，但同時也要做好有突發狀況的心理準備，這時候就要盡可能的冷靜處理，必要時不要怕找人協助。

整體來說，這次的交換機會讓我達成了非常多的夢想，像是體驗了歐洲當地學生的生活和風俗習慣，品嚐了歐洲各地不同的美食和食材，參訪了許多博物館、宮殿、歷史建築、集中營、動畫實體場景等等各種有不同重要意義的地方。不過期間除了大大小小的驚喜之外，也遇到了大大小小的驚嚇。小到搭車被票務人員刁難，被各種政府、水電公司、保險公司的德文文件和手續弄得頭昏眼花甚至差點沒辦法考期末考，大到搭飛機機票超賣導致被強制換班機行程大延誤。這些親身經歷讓我對德國和歐洲的好壞有更深的認識，也學到了不少沒有這次出國經驗就沒辦法學到的事情，所以我還是認為有機會的話能夠出國交換一次是很好的。

TH-Nuernberg is located in Nuremberg, Germany. It has many departments with many students from all over the world and is never absent from international interactions.

First I would like to thank the International Office of TH-Nuernberg and also my Taiwanese and international friends in TH-Nuernberg for helping me when I required help during my stay. The International Office of TH-Nuernberg also arranged many activities such as city tours, trips, parties and culture nights for international students that allowed us to learn and experience European culture and also share their own with other people.

At school I recommend choosing courses related to your field of study and also German language courses. I benefitted the most from a finance related course and German language course. The language course teaches things that can be used in daily life right away and the teachers in the finance course not only lectures about theory but also gives real world applications as examples during lectures which is quite useful. And of course English is extremely important and directly affects how well and efficient you can do in lectures and studying.

About extracurricular activities, I highly recommend seizing the opportunity to travel around and visit places that tickles your fancy. Taking myself as example, I am quite interested in history, weaponry and old architecture from the medieval to recent times. Therefore I traveled around in Nuremberg, nearby towns and cities and also further cities in Germany and Europe. I visited old city centers, palaces and castles there. I also visited museums, former Nazi government sites and concentration camps. These places usually have preserved artifacts and architecture with enormous amounts of information to read and learn about.

In daily life, try not to interact with people from different backgrounds with no prejudice. Also when doing and arranging things, try to plan beforehand and always be ready for things to not go according to plan. When something happens try staying calm and deal with it, always ask for help if necessary.

Overall, this exchange chance made a lot of my dreams come true and also made me more independent and deal with problems in a calm manner. Such as experiencing the life of European university students and local culture, tasting cuisines and foods from different parts of Europe, visited several places with significant meaning for me like museums, palaces, castles, old city streets and centers, concentration camps and anime locations in real life. However, during the period I also experienced quite some shocks. From minor ones such as being bugged by train personnel, having to deal with German documents and bureaucracy from the government and insurance companies and energy companies which sometimes even almost resulted in me not able to take my exam, to major pains such as flights being overbooked resulting in a forced change of flights and a huge delay on my trip. These experiences allowed me to experience the good and bad sides of Europe and also allowed me to learn things I would never have the chance to learn if I wasn't exchanging abroad. So I would still highly recommend exchanging abroad if an opportunity is available.
