# VISA

Admitted exchange students should apply for a visa at the consulate in their region/country after obtaining the Acceptance Letter and the Approval Letter.

## VISITOR VISA

Students who stay in Taiwan for **less than six months (one semester)** should apply for a [Visitor Visa](#). Students from Hong Kong and Macao should apply via [this page](#).

A multiple-entry visitor visa allows you to travel to other countries during your stay. As long as entry is made before the 'Enter Before' date, the duration of stay will be calculated from the day following the entry date.

A single-entry visitor visa only allows you to enter Taiwan once. The visa will expire once you depart from Taiwan.

With a Visitor Visa, each student may stay for 60/90 days and apply for a maximum of two extensions, each for 60/90 days.

The extensions should be made within **2 weeks** before the 60/90 days are due. Find more information on [this page](#).

## RESIDENT VISA

Students who are staying in Taiwan for **more than six months (full academic year)** should apply for a [Resident Visa](#).

The Resident Visa must be changed to the Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) within **30 days** after arrival.

## VISA-EXEMPT ENTRY

We request that all students apply for a visa to enter Taiwan in case of any unforeseen incidents.

# REGISTRATION & INSURANCE IN TAIWAN

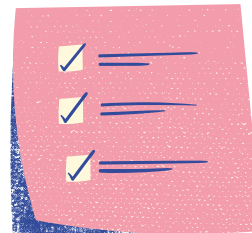
All international exchange students must complete registration on the first and second days of the semester to be officially enrolled. They will receive a student card after completing the registration.

## TRAVEL INSURANCE

### Registration Requirement 1

You are required to purchase overseas travel insurance with **medical** and **accident** policies before coming to Taiwan.

The insurance plan **in English version** must be submitted upon registration.

## STUDENT GROUP INSURANCE

All NSYSU students must purchase Student Group Insurance, which mainly covers accidents.

The fee is **NTD465** per semester, and it will be included in the tuition and fees payment invoice. You should pay the fees during the registration period.

## NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE

According to the National Health Insurance (NHI) Act, any international student who is **continuously staying in Taiwan for over six months** is eligible to join the NHI.

Once you are qualified to join the NHI, please inform the OIA staff by email. If you have already joined the NHI program, please also inform OIA staff beforehand. The insurance fee will be included in the tuition and fees payment invoice every semester.

### Registration Requirement 2

#### Health Certificate

Students applied for one semester study should complete their **health certificate form C** before coming to Taiwan.

Students applied for one year study should complete the **health certificate form B** in their located country in order to apply for the residence visa.

# TUITION & FEES

Fee-paying Students are required to pay tuition fees according to the length of study and the number of credits they take.

## MAKE THE PAYMENT

All exchange students can make the payment by cash at any Post Office or Bank of Taiwan. If the fee is less than NT20,000, the payment can also be made at any convenience store in Taiwan.



**It is important to check with your bank for your weekly/monthly overseas withdrawal limitation.**

**The fees must be paid in a lump sum during the registration period (first and second day of the semester).**

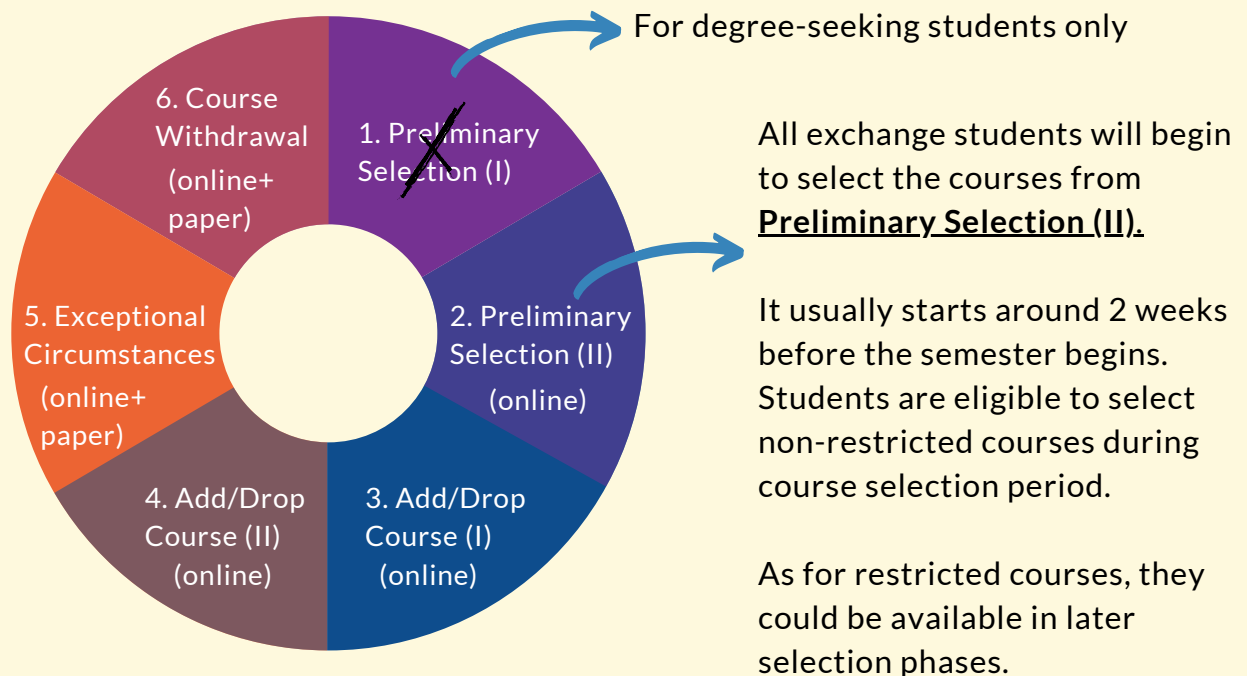
**Username:** Your student ID number

**Password:** Your initial password is the first two letters of your given name repeated, with the first letter in capital and the second letter in lowercase, followed by your birthday (MMDD).

E.g., Hana TING, born on July 1, the password will be "Haha0701".

Your student ID number and the course selection instructions will be sent around 1 month before the semester begins.

## COURSE SELECTION PHASES



Most professors will provide a brief introduction to their course and may open additional slots for interested students during the **first weeks**. We strongly recommend attending the courses you are interested in during this period, regardless of whether you have already selected them.

### USEFUL TIPS

1. The course selection process run on a machine lottery basis.
2. We will publish a list of English-taught courses on the [OIA website](#) before course selection begins. Please note that courses may continue to be added or updated until the semester starts, so we recommend checking the **Course Selection System** regularly for **the latest information**.
3. **Students may select courses from different levels starting from Add/Drop Course (I). Undergraduate students can choose master-level courses. A master's student can choose undergraduate and doctoral-level courses.**
4. **Students may not select courses with an overlapped schedule.**
5. Sports courses are categorized as bachelor-level courses, and we recommend you take Yachting and Aquatic Recreation Activities courses. They are popular among all students but not mandatory.

# CHINESE LANGUAGE COURSE

*Exchange students can apply for the free Chinese Language Course when applying for the exchange program.*

NSYSU provides free Chinese language courses to international exchange students.

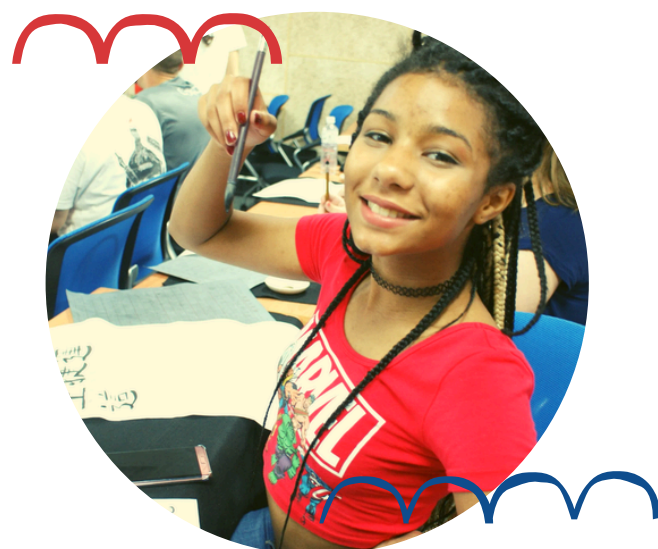
The aim is to provide them with an opportunity to further enhance their Chinese language skills and ease the transition to their life and study in Taiwan.

The Chinese Language Center will assign students to an appropriate level of class per their Mandarin proficiency.

According to our senior students, the Chinese language course is not a course you would like to miss!

Chinese language course is a 3 credits course, 4 hours per week.

Attendance and effort are both important to pass the course!



## BEGINNERS CLASS

Students who have applied for the Chinese language course with zero Mandarin bases will be assigned to the beginners class.

The beginner's class is held on every Tues. & Fri. 12:10-14:00. **Most exchange students will be assigned to Tue & Fri courses.**

## PLACEMENT TESTS

Students who have learned Mandarin before will need to take placement tests before the semester starts.

The Reading / Writing / Listening Tests will be shared via email, and students will have to complete the tests on time.

If you missed the deadline, the Chinese Language Center will **NOT** assign you to any class!

**It is important to attend the Mandarin course in the first week, as you will have only one chance to ask for a level change.**

After the first week of classes, the course will be officially registered on your course list.



# BUDDY PROGRAM

The Buddy Program aims to help international students adapt to the campus and local life as soon as possible.

## WHO ARE THE BUDDIES?

Each semester, we will open the opportunity for current NSYSU students to join the Buddy Program.

They come from different departments and colleges, and they are all volunteers to help with the international students' arrival.

Buddies are assigned to different groups, which are supported by experienced seniors.



### Useful Tips

*Taiwanese buddies are sometimes shy in social interaction. Give them some time and chances to hang out together. You will find your life in Taiwan easier and more fun with them around.*

*If you find your buddy not suitable for you, join our activities to meet more local students!*



## HOW DOES IT WORK?

When there are not enough buddies to assign one to each exchange student, we will open registration for the Buddy Program. Only those who successfully register will be assigned a buddy.

If you are successfully matched with a buddy, your email address will be given to them before the semester starts, and they will contact you with a virtual greeting.

If you registered for the Buddy Program but do not receive any contact two weeks before the semester begins, please inform your OIA coordinator.



# HOUSING

Students can apply for on-campus dormitories when applying for the exchange program, but they are not guaranteed.



## DORMITORY

On-campus housing affairs are managed by the Campus Housing Service Division (CHSD).

The room number will be shared with you by email around 1-1.5 months before the semester starts.

Smoking is prohibited in all school areas.

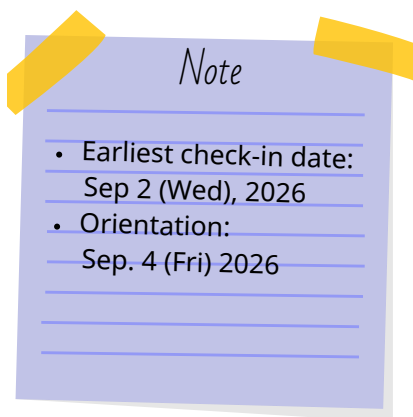
# ARRIVAL

## ORIENTATION

The Orientation and Campus Tour are usually held on Friday before class begins.

Topics including visa, insurance, general regulations, and course selection will be shared at the Orientation.

You will also receive the registration materials on that day. **It is mandatory for exchange students to attend the Orientation.**



## DORM CHECK-IN

The dorm will usually open for check-in 5 days before the semester starts. Please visit the designated dorm office to collect the keys.

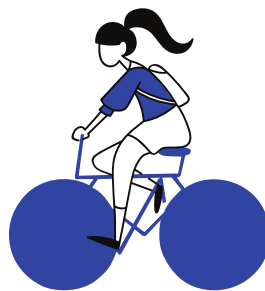

# TRANSPORTATION

## DRIVER'S LICENSE

An international driving permit (IDP) is required to drive in Taiwan.

Students from countries that have reciprocal agreements with Taiwan can use their IDP for up to 30 days after arrival. After 30 days, it is required by law to have an International Driving Permit Visa or R.O.C. (Taiwan) Driver's License if they wish to continue driving in Taiwan.

If your country does not have a reciprocal arrangement with Taiwan for an international driving permit, you must sit a written test and take a driver's examination (only applicable for students with ARC). Find more information [here](#).

- You will need an IDP to rent a scooter or car in Taiwan. An IDP for a car **CAN'T** be used for scooters. You must have a scooter driving permit for General Heavy Motorcycles (50–250 cc) to ride a general heavy scooter (most common) in Taiwan.

## VEHICLE RENTAL

Please search for a certified company to rent a scooter/car.

Both parties should sign a clear contract. The company should present its valid license, and you should be asked to show your international driving permit.

The rental company should purchase compulsory insurance for vehicles, and **we strongly suggest you buy extra insurance** such as **liability insurance for third parties** and **property damage insurance** in case big amounts of compensation are requested.

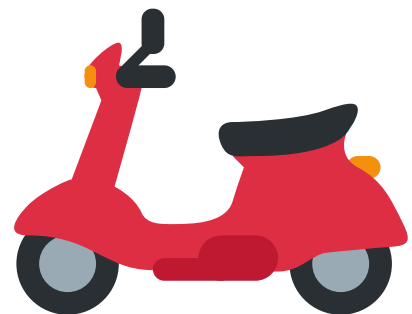

## PARKING ON-CAMPUS

You should apply for a parking permit to park your scooter on campus. The fee is 300NTD per year.

If you didn't park your vehicle in designated areas, it could be towed.

Visit the Vehicle Management Committee for applying for the parking permit.

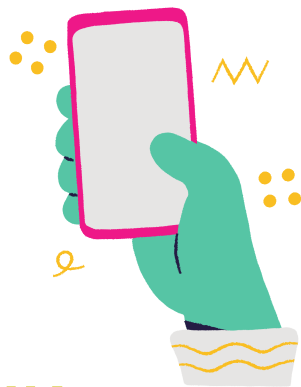

## WIRELESS NETWORK

The NSYSU campus is mostly covered by a wireless network named TANetRoaming.

Most of our dormitories are not covered by a wireless network, you can buy or bring a suitable cable or router for using the internet in the dorm.


Don't forget to bring an adapter for electrical appliances. The current in Taiwan is 110 volts.



## OPEN A BANK ACCOUNT IN TAIWAN

We recommend you open a bank account at the Post Office if you carry a large amount of cash or if you will receive a scholarship.

Requirements:

1. Personal Seal (optional)
2. Passport
3. Taiwan ID No. 
4. Student ID (for the Post Office on campus)
5. Self-Certification Form (Individual for the Post Office only)
6. 10-1,000NTD

**\*The Post Office only accepts TW-EU scholarship recipients to open an account. If you're a scholarship recipient, please also prepare your certificate of scholarship.**



## SIM CARD

We suggest you purchase a prepaid card from one of the mobile network carriers at the airport or the cellular company in the city.

There could be a student discount if you bring your student card.
