Application	All students must be nominated by their home university before applying to NAU. Once nominated, students will receive an email from the NAU exchange coordinator with the link and instructions to apply to NAU. Master’s students may participate in exchange at NAU; they are admitted as undergraduates and are eligible to take both undergraduate and graduate courses.

Test Scores Needed for Admission	Minimum GPA: 2.5/4.0 https://nau.edu/isss/application-requirements/ English Proficiency minimum requirements are as follows: • TOEFL: 70 IBT (School code 4006, MyBestScore accepted) – send scores directly from ETS. On new TOEFL score scale (starting Jan. 21, 2026), minimum score is 3.5. • IELTS: 6 • Duolingo: 95 – send scores directly from DuoLingo • Exchange Student from Europe: B2 level in English • High school or university taught entirely in English: 4 years of high school English (composition and literature) with passing grades and/or verification from your school that all courses are taught in English.

Courses	Courses at NAU are conducted in English. The course catalog can be found at http://catalog.nau.edu . Exchange students must enroll in a minimum of 12 in-person credits each semester (typically 4 courses). The maximum number of credits students can enroll in is 19 per semester (typically 6 courses). All majors are open to exchange students, excluding Dental Hygiene and Nursing. Music programs have additional, higher application requirements. Enrollment depends on availability of classes and student’s eligibility.			
Housing	Most exchange students live on campus at the NAU International House - a living and learning community for international and American students: http://nau.edu/CIE/International-House . Other on-campus housing: https://nau.edu/flagstaff-campus/campus-living/ . Students will apply for housing after they have been admitted to NAU. Housing on campus is limited, so it is recommended that students apply for housing immediately upon receiving their admissions email. Students should not wait to apply for housing.
