Student Status	Students must be enrolled as undergraduate/graduate students at their home institutions which have exchange agreements with the SSS/GSSS, Waseda University and continuously enrolled until the end of the exchange study period.
Language	Students must have a good command of English or Japanese depending on the desired program. • English based Program: TOEFL iBT 80/IELTS 6.0 • Japanese based program: Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N1
GPA	No specific GPA requirement. • Students must have excellent academic and personal records at their home institutions and strong motivation with a clear study plan in any field available at the SSS/GSSS, Waseda University.

Process	[STEP 1] Nominated students complete the designated online Application*. *URL for the online Application will be provided to students' home institution after nomination. [STEP 2] Students prepare the required documents and submit to their home institution. [STEP 3] Home institution checks the documents and signs the "Important Notice regarding the Selection of Exchange Student" form. [STEP 4] Home institution submits the scanned copies of the documents to Faculty of Social Sciences, Waseda University via Email.

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COE & VISA APPLICATION

COE (Certificate of Eligibility) Application	
Process (tentative)	COE (Certificate of Eligibility) is an official document issued by the Immigration Services Bureau in Japan which is required when students apply for Japanese visa in their home country. Students will be informed to submit COE application documents to Waseda University and Waseda University will apply for the COE to Immigration Services Bureau on behalf of the students.
Required Documents (tentative)	Designated forms and detailed instructions will be sent to students after the Nomination/Application process. 1. Application Form for the Certificate of Eligibility (COE) 2. Statement of Financial Resources 3. Agreement for Defraying Expenses 4. Proof of Financial Resources 5. Data of Color Passport Sized Photo 6. Copy of Passport ID page (if updated) ※Some application documents are modified and added from AY2026 intake. For details, we will announce you later.
Visa Application	
Process (tentative)	COE will be sent to students via email once Waseda University receives it from the Immigration Services Bureau. Please note that it takes 2 to 3 months for the COE issuance after the application and Waseda University has no control over the issuance time. Upon receiving COE, students need to apply for a student visa at the nearest Japanese Embassy or Consulate.

Living Expenses	According to the survey by JASSO (Japan Student Services Organization), the average cost of studying and living in Tokyo as university student is 154,000 JPY per month. Please make sure to prepare enough funds for your stay before you come to Japan.
Accommodation (tentative)	[Dormitories] SSS/GSSS exchange students have the option of applying for the student dormitories called "WID" and "DORMY".
