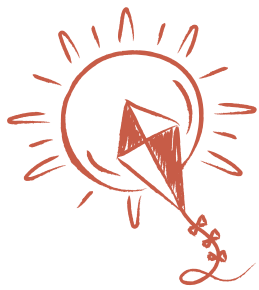

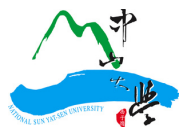

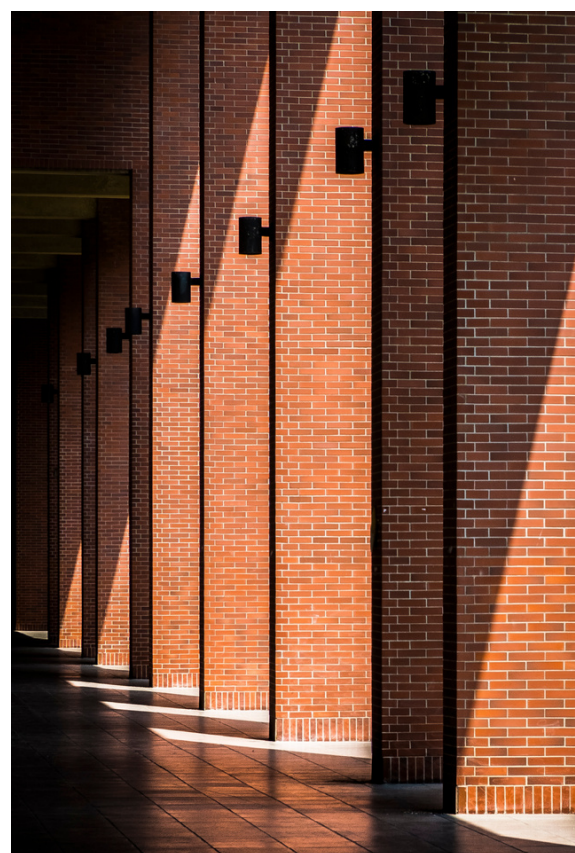

VISA

Admitted visiting students can apply for a visa at an overseas Taiwan embassy after receiving the Letter of Acceptance.



VISITOR VISA

Students who are staying in Taiwan for **less than 180 days (one semester)** should apply for a Visitor Visa.

With a Visitor Visa, each student may stay for 60/90 days and apply for a maximum of two extensions, each for 60/90 days.

The extensions should be made **2 weeks** before the 60/90 days are due. Find more information on [this page](#).

RESIDENT VISA

Students who are staying in Taiwan for **more than 180 days (full academic year)** should apply for a Resident Visa. (The final decision will be made by the embassy.)

The Resident Visa must be changed to the Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) within **30 days** after completing the quarantine.

INSURANCE & HEALTH CERTIFICATE

All international students are required to purchase overseas travel insurance, and it must cover the whole duration of their stay in Taiwan.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

Registration Requirement

You are required to purchase overseas travel insurance with **medical care and accident policies** before coming to Taiwan.

The insurance plan in English version must be submitted upon registration.



STUDENT GROUP INSURANCE

All NSYSU students must purchase Student Group Insurance.

The fee is NTD 465 per semester, and it will be included in the tuition & fees payment bill, which should be paid upon registration period.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE

According to the National Health Insurance (NHI) Act, any international student who is **continuously staying in Taiwan for over six months** is eligible to join the NHI.

Once you are qualified to join the NHI, please inform OIA staff by email. If you have already joined the NHI program, please also inform OIA staff beforehand. The insurance fee will be included in the tuition & fees payment bill every semester.

Registration Requirement

Health Certificate

Students who applied for more than **90** days should complete their health certificate form C before coming to Taiwan.

Students applied for a oneyear study should complete the health certificate form B in their country in order to apply for the residence visa.

FEES

PROGRAM FEE

Visiting Students are required to pay tuition fees according to the length of study. Below is the charging standard of the management fee:

- within 31 days: free of charge
 - 32 to 62 days: TWD 3,000
 - 63 to 92 days: TWD 6,000
 - 93 days or more : TWD 9,000
- Visiting students participating in the Taiwan Experience Education Program (TEEP) shall be charged half of the standard fee; those in the International Internship Pilot Program (IIPP) shall be charged the standard fee.
 - Visiting students who cancel their visit before enrollment at NSYSU shall be exempt from paying the management fee; the payment shall be non-refundable once the enrollment is completed.

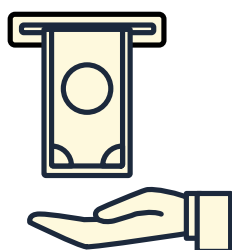

- Internet Fee and Student Group Insurance fees are charged on a **per-semester** basis.
- The **Administration fees** are charged when applying for visiting student status. The **Program Fee, Internet Fee, and Student Group Insurance Fee** will be charged after you arrive in Taiwan during the registration process.
- All fees are subject to change in accordance with the latest announcements issued by National Sun Yat-sen University (NSYSU).

MAKE THE PAYMENT

All visiting students can make the payment by cash at any Post Office and Bank of Taiwan. If the fee is less than NT20,000, the payment can also be made at any convenience store in Taiwan.



It is important to check with your bank for your weekly/monthly overseas withdrawal limitation.

The fees must be paid in a lump sum during the registration period.

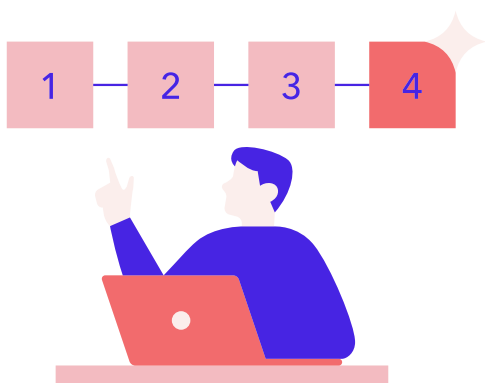

You will need to complete registration within **5** working days after arrival to receive a student ID card.



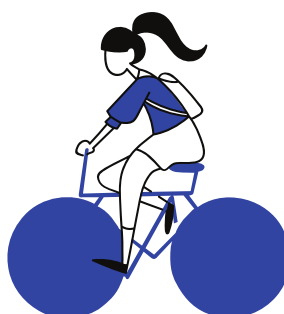
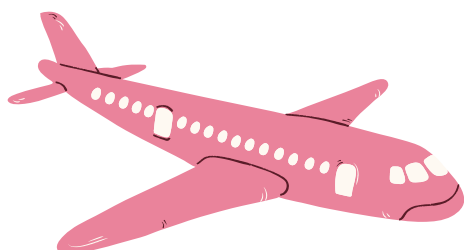
TRANSPORTATION

TRANSPORTATION

DRIVER'S LICENSE

An international driving permit (IDP) is required to drive in Taiwan.

Students from countries with reciprocal agreements with Taiwan can use their IDP for up to 30 days after arrival. After 30 days, it is required by law to have an International Driving Permit Visa or R.O.C. (Taiwan) Driver's License if they wish to continue driving in Taiwan.

If your country does not have a reciprocal arrangement with Taiwan for an international driving permit, you must sit a written test and take a driver's examination (only applicable for students with ARC). Find more information [here](#).

- You will need an IDP to rent a scooter or car in Taiwan. An IDP for a car **CAN'T** be used for scooters. You must have a scooter driving permit for General Heavy Motorcycles (50–250 cc) to ride a general heavy scooter (most common) in Taiwan.

VEHICLE RENTAL

Please search for a certified company for renting a scooter/car.

Both sides should sign a clear contract. The company should present its validated certificate and you should be asked to show your international driving permit.

The rental company should purchase compulsory insurance for vehicles, and **we strongly suggest you buy extra insurance** such as **liability insurance for third parties** and **property damage insurance** in case of big amounts of compensation are requested.

NSYSU Parking Permit, Scooter Retrieve, Paying fine, borrowing & returning NSYSU bike, ...etc.

PARKING ON-CAMPUS

You should apply for a parking permit to park your scooter on campus. The fee is 300NTD per year.

If you didn't park your vehicle in designated areas, it could be towed.

Visit the Vehicle Management Committee for applying for the parking permit.



WIFI & ELECTRICITY

The NSYSU campus is mostly covered by a wireless network called TANetRoaming.

You will receive an account and password to access the university's WiFi.

Simply select the WiFi network, open your browser, and a login page will appear.

Choose "Guest" as your status, then enter the provided account and password.

Taiwan operates on a 110V electrical system. Please bring an adapter if needed.



SIM CARD

Please purchase a prepaid card from one of the mobile network carriers at the airport or the cellular company in the city.

OPEN A BANK ACCOUNT IN TAIWAN

We recommend you open a bank account at the Post Office if you carry a big amount of cash or if you will receive a stipend or scholarship.
